Confidentiality

The counselor strives to uphold the highest level of confidentiality with students while following the legal and ethical guidelines regarding student and parent rights to information.

What students tell the counselor is confidential unless there is a need to prevent clear and imminent danger to the student or others or when legal requirements demand that confidential information be revealed.

Group Counseling

Group counseling involves a small group of children in which similar needs are addressed outside the regular classroom. Groups are formed based on need, and may include topics such as:

- · Anger resolution
- · Building self confidence
- · Divorce/blended families
- · Friendship skills
- · Grief/loss
- · Problem solving skills
- · Study skills

School counselors develop confidential relationships with students to help them resolve or cope with problems and developmental concerns.



Elementary Guidance

In the elementary, character education themes are incorporated into the curriculum. Beyond this, the school counselor is also able to teach lessons in the regular classroom on occasion to focus on topics that also promote Academic, Personal, Social, and Career growth. Some topics covered may be:
