Reopening Plan Overview

1. School 5 Days per Week
2. Health Safety Precautions
 - a. Additional Cleaning as needed
 - b. Will accommodate needs of all students
3. All services will be provided as normal.



Reopening Plan Overview

1. **Positive cases and close contacts will be advised to follow instructions of Polk County Health Dept or other medical providers.**
2. **The district will not be doing contact tracing or informing families of positive cases.**
3. **The district will follow any mandates from authorities**

Standard Protocol Moving Forward

1. Increase ventilation as needed.
2. Increased cleaning as needed.
3. Clorox 360 machine used as needed.
4. Hand sanitizer and wipes readily available.
5. Hand Washing will be prioritized



*Dependent of staffing of janitorial staff which is a concern in this environment

Day to Day

Standard Protocol Moving Forward



1. Virtual Meetings will still be available.
2. Appointments needed for meetings with staff during the day.
3. Parents limited to main entrance/district office only
 - a. No going through building
4. No one in the building before or after school for student pickup
5. High risk students should communicate with the district to receive accommodations

Personal Protective Equipment

1. Face coverings are optional and allowed by students and staffs.
2. Masks will be available for students and staff if requested.



Screening



- **Parents should continue to screen students for COVID symptoms before coming to school**
- **Students showing symptoms should stay home until symptom free.**

Vaccination information will be available by request only.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES



- 1. Rely on and implement guidance from WIAA to safely hold athletic practices and contests**
- 2. Competitions and contests will be held with spectators. An effort will be made to stream all events live.**
- 3. Activities and events may be postponed, spectators limited and/or adjusted guidelines and/or current conditions to meet state or local guidelines.**

Community Ed

- 1. Will continue with classes.
- 2. Trips will continue.

Facility Usage

- 1. Student learning first priority
- 2. Facilities will be open to outside groups
