## **Changes to the Campus...**

As most know, our school is becoming quite the construction site. But what really is going to be made out of that dirt pile on the South side of the campus?



For starters, there will be a FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) approved safe room that doubles as a gym area. This will also serve as the main entrance for all indoor sporting events. By the end of the school year, both the girls, and the boys locker rooms will be completely gutted, and prepared for remodel. This remodel will include: 2 girls locker rooms, 2 boys locker rooms, individual showers, and new bathrooms in the area.





The stage has already been updated (new floor, new curtain). New lighting will also be installed on the stage after the new gym is finished. In the library, new carpet and shelves have been installed. After remodel, there will be new panels, a new paint job, new tables, and a new floor in the greenhouse. New cabinets have been ordered for all high school rooms, which will be remodeled one at a time throughout the school year. The science room, FACE room, and shop are all scheduled for a remodel towards the end of all renovations.

During this time, the main ms/hs bathrooms, 5th grade-area bathrooms, and 2nd grade-area bathrooms will all be refinished. This set of remodels will be completed during the school year, so there will be periods of time where one of these bathrooms will be out of order. A few other possibilities being explored are: new furniture for the commons area, new lockers for the middle school area, and new playground equipment if necessary. Finally, as most probably already know, the school parking lot will be extended westward, and an entrance has been added to the north to help with traffic flow.



### **Catalhoyuk Houses**

Ms. Wicklund's freshmen class has been busy learning about the Catalhoyuk people and how they built their Catalhoyuk houses. The freshmen were required to make a house similar to what the Catalhoyuks made. They got to use cardboard boxes and decorate them with wall paintings, fireplaces, trapdoors instead of regular doors, ladders, pottery and/or stoves. After they completed the houses, they got to burn them in the homecoming bonfire.

The excavation is pretty new and they still have a lot to dig. The site was first excavated by James Mellaart in 1959. He led a team in 1961 and 1965 to continue the dig. These excavations revealed a center of advanced culture in the Neolithic period. An interesting thing that excavators have found is that when they lost one of their family members, instead of burying them in a cemetery like we would, they buried them under their floor. They do this so they can feel closer to them after they pass away. Ms. Wicklund and her students had a blast making these houses.





### **Anders Dueholm**


