Luck Cardinals Summer Program 2024

The Luck School District has created a variety of classes that include project-based academic enrichment and activities that are designed to instill a love of learning and discovery as students expolore their interests.

Summer School: 4 independent weeks - 2 sessions each day unless otherwise noted in the flyer. Summer school will run Monday-Thursday from 8:00AM to 1:00PM. Dates include June 3-6, June 10-13, June 17-20, and June 24-27.

Swimming Lessons: Held the first two weeks of summer school (Monday-Thursday) from 1:00-3:30PM. Dates include June 3-6 and June 10-13.

Athletic Camps: Held the second two weeks of summer school (Monday-Thursday) from 1:00-3:30PM. Dates include June 17-20 and June 24-27. There will be a variety of camps for different sports. More information to come.

Field Trips: Held every Friday in June!

For students who DO NOT enroll in Swimming Lessons and/or Athletic Camps, there will be alternate activities offered at the school until 3:30PM.

Please fill out the registration form with all necessary information. Have your child rank the electives they want included in their daily summer school schedule. There are a limited number of spaces, so the electives will be granted on a first come first served basis. Please make sure you specify all of the sessions your child will be attending for summer school. If you need assistance with the online form, please contact the District Office at 715-472-2152.

Transportation

SWIMMING LESSONS

All classes are from the Learn To Swim Program by the American Red Cross taught by certified Water Safety Instructors. Classes held at Unity School District. Use the online Summer Program form to register.

Pre-Level 1 | Age 4-5

Classes take place in the kiddie pool with progression to the big pool. This class is taught without a parent present (parents are welcome to watch class from the observation room). Swimmers will work on entering and exiting the water safely and independently, submerging mouth and blowing bubbles, front and back glides with assistance and combined arm and leg actions on the front and back with assistance.

Level 1 - Introduction to Water Skills | Age 5 and Up

Basic swim skills and safety skills will be performed with assistance in the big pool. Swimmers will work on bobbing, retrieving submerged objects, front and back glides, combined, alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on the front and back all with assistance.

<u>Level 2 - Fundamental Aquatic Skills | Age 6 and Up</u>

Basic swim skills and safety skills will be performed without assistance in the big pool. Swimmers will work on submerging, front and back glides, combined, alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on the front and back without assistance. Swimmers must be able to perform the exit skill of swimming on their front for 5 body lengths, rolling to their back, floating for 15 seconds, rolling to their front and then continue swimming for 5 body lengths in order to move on to Level 3.

<u>Level 3 - Stroke Development | Age 7 and Up and/or Successful Completion of Level 2</u>

Swimmers will focus on the flutter, scissor, breaststroke and dolphin kicks. They will also focus on increasing their distances of the Front Crawl, Elementary Backstroke and Back Crawl. Diving will also be introduced.

<u>Levels 4 - Stroke Improvement | Successful Completion of Level 3</u>

Swimmers should already be able to: swim front and back crawl 25 yards. Swimmers will work on: rotary breathing, freestyle, backstroke, elementary backstroke, scissors kick and sidestroke, whip kick and breaststroke, intro to turning at wall, treading water with modified scissors, and diving in kneeling position.

Level 5 - Stroke Refinement | Successful Completion of Level 4

Swimmers should already be able to: swim freestyle, breaststroke and backstroke 25 yards, scissors kick, whip kick, treading water, and dive. Swimmers will work on: alternate breathing, stride jump, refinement of: freestyle, backstroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, breaststroke, dolphin kick and butterfly, open turn on front and back, feet-first surface dive, and treading water.

<u>Level 6 - Swimming & Skill Proficiency | Successful Completion of Level 5</u>

Swimmers should already be able to: swim front and back crawl 50 yds, elementary backstroke 25 yards, breaststroke 25 yards, butterfly 25 yards, sidestroke 10 yards, tread water for 3 minutes, and dive. Swimmers will work on: All six strokes, front and back crawl flip turn, breaststroke turn, breaststroke speed turn and pullout, butterfly turn, sidestroke turn, pike and tuck surface dive, pike and tuck dive from board, tread water for five minutes, and basic water rescue.

Registration and payment are due one week before the scheduled trip for the aquarium, Fawn-Doe-Rosa, and the Children's Museum. Registration and payment for the Children's Theatre is due by Friday, May 3. Students in grades K-5 MUST have an adult accompany them. Use the online Summer Program form to register.




June 7 | Great Lakes Aquarium, Duluth | \$10/Person

Students Entering Kindergarten


Children entering kindergarten will be in a self-contained classroom for summer school. They will be developing social skills and working/playing together with friends. Students will become familiar with the kindergarten routine and structure to help ensure a successful start in the fall. Through songs, games, art, and stories they will be involved in a new theme each week.

Students Entering 1st Grade

Students Entering 2nd Grade

Students Entering 3, 4, & 5 Grades

Cupcake Wars - Have you ever seen those fancy cakes and said, "I want to make those!"? In this class you will learn techniques to make fun cupcakes. Work in groups to create the most creative, colorful, and delicious cupcakes.

Math Camp - Let's play with numbers! It will be a week filled with games, practicing different skills, math projects, and math stories. We will be using our imagination, creativity, and problem solving skills to learn about math.

Children's Book Club - Let's dive into some good books! Sharing our love for reading through different types of stories. We will use our imagination and creativity to help make the books come alive. We will have activities that will go along with the stories we read and try to discover some new authors along the way.

Wild for Wildlife - Explore the great outdoors that surround our school. Students will take part in a variety of outdoor activities including fishing, mucking for aquatic insects, wildlife and plant identification, creating wildlife shelters, environmental games, and more.

Wild About Wild Animals - Safari time, design a hat, watch wild animals in action, research, write, then create wild animals with clay.

Exploring Science with Experiments - Students will have the opportunity to bring out their creative side in unusual and fun ways through science projects and experiments that students will be able to enjoy again at home. Students will learn to follow step by step directions and create masterpieces that are for all skill levels.

Let's Go Fishing (All Day) - Students will learn how to set up fishing poles, select the right lures, identify fish, and clean fish. Yes, we will actually fish!

Phy Ed Fanatics - Students will play a variey of games/activities from phy ed class.

Outdoor Games - Students will learn and play games designed to be played outdoors such as bag toss, can jam, tag based games, boccie ball, and more!

Golf Galore - Students will try their hand at a variety of "golf based" games including disc golf, ladder golf, golf billiards, and tennis golf challenges.

Flag Football - Students will learn the basics of football and the skills that come with that.

Ultimate Sports - Students will learn the ultimate side of their favorite sport. Students will learn ultimate Frisbee and football, just to name a few, while learning the importance of sportsmanship and being a team player.

Summer Recess - Students will learn traditional recess games including kickball, beanbag toss, and other summertime activities.

Poetry - Are you team groan or team cheer when it comes to poetry? In this class, students with any reaction are welcome! Anyone can dissect poems and have a blast discussing them. Students will interpret poetry by interacting with the words in unique ways instead of the traditional "listen to the teacher, read, then answer comprehension questions" style. This is a chance to imagine the possibilities words hold as we examine a variety of short poems through the lens of summertime daydreamers. Let's take a wild ride through the enigmatic world of poetry styles and writing wizardry!

Zombie Outbreak - Have you ever watched a zombie movie and wondered how you'd do if you woke up to a zombie takeover? Here is a chance to play pretend with tactical co-ops and logic based strategies as you envision our very own school as your safe zone when zombies attack. In this class, students engage in hands-on activities while using their imaginations to pretend a zombie outbreak is causing chaos in the village of Luck. This involves comic book strip writing, podcast usage, journaling, and various artistic elements. Students have the chance to test their acting skills in addition to fine-tuning their logical thinking. *This will not include super gross details or scary themes!

Creative Writing - Whether writing assignments are your favorite or they're your worst nightmare, I guarantee you'll enjoy working on short story skills with total creative freedom! Learn quick tips and tricks to elevate your writing, putting them to use right away and workshopping with others without the pressure of grades. In this class, students will work on creative writing skills that develop across grade levels like building blocks, giving them a chance to get ahead or catch up! By experimenting with different storytelling techniques, students will not only enhance their writing abilities but also gain confidence in their creative expression. Specific topics will be guided based on enrolled students' input.

Stay Curious! - Does that phrase sound familiar? If you heard Mystery Doug saying those words, then you probably can guess what this class is all about... Let's ask ALL of the questions and stay curious this summer! Students enjoy standalone science experiments and mini-lessons to examine the facts behind the magic of the world around us. Although some content may connect to our Mystery Science curriculum, this will not be the typical lessons, avoiding any chance of repeated activities/spoiling future lessons students might have later on!

Microscopes for Newbies (limit of 7 students) - Have you ever wondered what dog hair, fish eggs, human scabs, and butterfly wings have in common? Probably not, but here's your chance! In this class, students dive into the magical realm of microscopes to look at everyday materials and find connections they've never considered before! Students will learn the basic parts and functions of microscopes through actual usage as they take on the role of scientists.

Become a Novelist - Ready to dive into the magical world of creating your own masterpiece, but worried you'll get lost along the way? If you've ever started to write the next great novel, then given up after 10 pages, you're not alone- NaNoWriMo exists for a reason! This class is a mini version of that. In this class, students will learn how to take the daunting task of writing a full-length novel and break down the steps in a more manageable way. Students will craft a plan to make their dream book a reality. Students with detailed ideas for novels, students with a bunch of half-finished stories, and students just beginning to like the sound of becoming a novelist are all welcome!

Junior Justices: A Mock Trial Adventure - Dive into the world of courtroom drama! This interactive summer class invites upper elementary students to step into the roles of lawyers, witnesses, and jurors, as they explore the ins and outs of the judicial system through a fun and engaging mock trial. This class combines critical thinking, public speaking, and teamwork, all within the thrilling context of solving and arguing a case from start to finish.

Creative Chronicles: Mixed Media Journaling - Unleash your inner artist and storyteller! This class is designed for students eager to explore the vibrant world of expressive journaling. Aimed at creative spirits, this course invites young learners to dive into the art of journaling using a variety of materials and techniques. From paints and collage to digital elements and photography, students will discover new ways to capture their thoughts, dreams, and daily adventures.

Students Entering 6, 7, & 8 Grades
