Greetings School District of Luck Residents:

Thank you for your attendance at the 2022-2023 annual meeting for the School District of Luck. A growth mindset continues to be the focus at the School District of Luck. During the past school year, the district has utilized one-time federal money to upgrade curriculum. This process will continue into next year to ensure all of our materials are up to date and our staff has the resources available to provide the best education for the students of the district.

Facility upgrades have been a top priority. The passage of the building referendum has accelerated this process. By the end of the construction, the majority of the rooms will be remodeled. The addition of the FEMA safe room will not only provide a place for our students and community during severe weather, but will also serve as additional gym for classroom and after school activities. With inflation and lack of bids, this process has taken longer than initially expected. Work will continue all winter allowing the district to take advantage of contractors not in their busiest season. The district has also taken on portions of the remodel in-house. This allows the district to utilize our staff and local contractors while saving overhead on construction management fees. Everything has been done to ensure that all aspects of the referendum are met while staying in budget.

The School District of Luck has partnered with Northwood Tech for upcoming school year to offer construction essentials courses. These hands-on tech ed classes will not only teach our students valuable skills but will also be for college credits. As a small school, the district is committed to giving our students every opportunity possible. Business, Family and Consumer Education, Spanish and Agriculture/Tech Ed classes are available to our students. Even with staffing concerns and retirements, the district has been able to retain these valuable programs.

Goals of the district continue to be aligned with the district strategic plan.

1. Achieve excellence by supporting and focusing on the needs of students.
2. Partner and engage the community in the learning process.
3. Provide space and materials to ensure the maximum potential of the education process.

Our budget report reflects a projected budget based on the best current information we have. As the State provides final numbers, we will refine our revenue determinations and adjust our associated budget. While budget adjustments are made throughout the year to reflect the changing needs within our educational program as well as new information from the State, the current budget provides a good estimate of revenues and expenditures for the information we have today.

Participation of Electors at the Annual Meeting

Wisconsin Statute 65.90.4 states that *"any resident or taxpayer of the governmental unit shall have an opportunity to be heard on the proposed budget. ...In school districts holding an annual meeting, the time and place of the budget hearing shall be the time and place of the annual meeting."* The Attorney General has stated that the governing body, the Board of Education in this case, cannot be compelled to make changes suggested by citizens at the hearing on the proposed budget. The intent of the statute is to provide a forum for public opinion, allowing the governing body to act in a fashion it believes best serves the public interest. Therefore, electors do not have the authority to amend the proposed budget or to approve or disapprove such budget.

Following the budget hearing at the annual meeting, the electors in a common school district such as the School District of Luck have the power to vote a tax for the purposes set forth in s.120.10.6-.11. If the Annual Meeting has not voted a tax levy sufficient to operate and maintain the schools for the year, the School Board has the statutory obligation to determine the necessary levy prior to 1 November. Similarly, s. 120.12.3 provides the Board the ability to lower the tax if the annual meeting has voted a tax greater than that which is needed to operate the schools.

1. The annual meeting of the School District of Luck was called to order by President Jacob Jensen at 8:00 pm. Board members present were Sarah Cook, Amy Dueholm, Rick Palmer and Todd Roehm. Administration present were Jason Harelson, Brad Werner and Cory Hinkel. Others present were Junellyn Anderson, Recording Secretary; Marissa Bazey; Heather Zacco: Mary Stirrat of "Inter-County Leader".

Pledge of Allegiance by all.

2. President Jensen announced that the election of a chairperson would now take place. Rick Palmer nominated Jacob Jensen as Chairperson of the Annual Meeting, second by Amy Dueholm. There being no other nominations Todd Roehm moved to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot electing Jacob Jensen as Chair. Second by Rick Palmer. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.
3. Rick Palmer presented the 2020 Annual Meeting minutes. Motion was made by Cory Hinkel to waive the reading of the minutes from the September 28, 2020 Annual Meeting and approve as written. Second by Todd Roehm. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.
4. Marissa Bazey, Community Ed Director, presented the 2020-21 Community Ed report. A full written report is included in the Annual Meeting packet.
5. District Administrator Cory Hinkel reviewed the budget summaries, for all funds, for the 2020-21 unaudited budget and the 2021-22 proposed budget. Mr. Hinkel also reviewed the proposed tax levy and mill rate. There being no questions or comments Chairperson Jacob Jensen closed the budget hearing and presented the following Resolutions.

Resolution - Tax Levy

Be it resolved by the electors of the School District of Luck, that the proposed annual budget be accepted, and the tax levy be set at \$3,188,267. Motion by Rick Palmer to adopt the resolution as presented. Second by Sarah Cook. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.

6. **Resolution - Set Board Salaries**

Be it resolved by the electors of the School District of Luck, that the following yearly salaries be adopted for the members of the Board of Education for the 2021-2022 school year; President, a salary of \$1,500.00 and the directors, \$1,400.00 each. Be it also resolved that the Board members be paid their actual and necessary expenses when traveling outside the district in performance of his or her duties. Motion by Sarah Cook to adopt the resolution as presented. Second by Mary Stirrat. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.

7. Resolution - Authorizing Temporary Borrowing

Be it resolved the Board of Education is authorized to secure temporary loans up to \$1,000,000.00 the statutory limit, for the purpose of meeting the immediate expenses of maintaining the schools of the district. The amount of such loans shall be set by the Board of Education Motion by Rick Palmer to adopt the resolution as presented. Second by Todd Roehm. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.

8. Resolution - Lunch Program

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck is hereby directed to furnish hot lunch and breakfast to any and all students of this district at such places and times, and at such cost as shall be set by said School Board; and the School Board is authorized to pay any deficiency which may result from the lunch program. Motion by Todd Roehm to adopt the resolution as presented. Second by Amy Dueholm. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.

9. Resolution - Legal Counsel

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck is authorized to secure legal advice in any school action that is deemed necessary by said Board. Motion by Todd Roehm to adopt the resolution as presented. Second by Rick Palmer. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.

10. Resolution - Transportation

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck be authorized to maintain a program of bus transportation, including those students who live under the two mile statutory limit. Motion by Sarah Cook to adopt the resolution as presented. Second by Amy Dueholm. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.

11. Resolution - 2022 Annual Meeting

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck is authorized to set the Annual Meeting for 2022 for September 26th. Motion by Rick Palmer to adopt the resolution as presented. Second by Todd Roehm. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried.

12. Other Business Allowed by Wisconsin Statutes - None

13. Motion by Cory Hinkel to adjourn. Second by Rick Palmer. Voice vote, all aye. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:23 pm.

Classes and Day Trips

Over the past year, Luck Community Education has offered 32 classes and six day trips to the community. The day trips continue to be popular and fill up fast while the classes have taken a little more effort to get enough people registered to run them. A handful of classes had to be canceled last year due to low enrollment but the current class numbers are looking good. Water aerobics has been able to run year-round and has made a small profit. Last winter, a basketball open gym was offered and had a good turnout from the Luck community as well as from surrounding communities.

The current schedule includes 20 different classes and three day trips. I am excited to work with Renee Gavinski again for a holiday baking day and Torrie Gaffney for an intro to Spanish class which hasn't been offered for a few years. There are currently 12 people enrolled! Other popular classes include Gentle Yoga/Yoga Sculpt and Fall Cookie Decorating. I look forward to working with new staff members, Jenelle Larsen and James Springsteen, to come up with some exciting classes for next spring. I would also like to work with local businesses and organizations more so the current schedule includes ATV and Snowmobile safety classes offered by the Polk County Sheriff's Office as well as a dance class offered by Limitless Dance Studios, a new Luck business. There are also a number of online classes for those who prefer the comfort of their own home.

The upcoming day trips include the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum, The Church Basement Ladies at the Ames Center, and a second trip to "Footloose" at Chanhassen Dinner Theatre. Bigger buses had to be ordered for the first two trips in order to accommodate everyone who wanted to sign up! Luck Community Ed was scheduled to see "Hamilton" at the Orpheum Theatre in 2020 but that was postponed and will now take place next April.

Marketing

The new and improved district newsletter continued to go out in January and again in August. With so much information and news to cover throughout the year, the possibility of a third newsletter is being discussed and would be sent out in May/early June.

The new school website was launched at the beginning of the year. The site is more modern and user-friendly, featuring quick links to athletics, school board information, and food service on the homepage. An agreement has been signed to create a CMS4Schools school app, and that project should be getting underway shortly. Once started, it is a 30-60 day process.

Last spring and over the summer months, I have been documenting the referendum work and updating the community via Facebook posts and newspaper articles. With staff transitions at the newspaper, I will be covering the school's monthly board meetings and sending in articles when someone from the newspaper is unable to attend. Due to staff retirements, I will also be taking over Student of the Week for the district as well.

Last year, the Luck Activities Department made the decision to start creating the sports calendar poster in-house and run all sponsorships directly through the school. I took the lead on this and was able to create new sponsorship opportunities for local businesses, including a live

stream sponsorship for middle school and JV athletic games. These sponsorships generated \$6,250 last year and over \$7,000 this year for the Activities Department. These funds have allowed the department to enhance the current programs, offer extra opportunities to students, and purchase new equipment. This process has also given me the opportunity to connect with businesses.

School Events

An in-person Veterans Day program and Memorial Day program returned to the school this past year. Luck Community Ed worked with student organizations and the Food Service Department to plan the Veterans Day program and coordinate a luncheon for veterans. The Memorial Day program was coordinated with the American Legion and the Legion Auxiliary.

Prairie Fire Children's Theatre returned this past June, with 22 students participating. In order to offset more of the cost, the participation fee will need to be increased. Luck Community Ed will also try to identify a community sponsor to help cover some of the cost. Switching to an earlier week in June might help get more participants.

After hearing about the success of family dances at other school districts, Community Ed has partnered with the basketball program to bring the Family Fall Ball to the Luck School District. This event is scheduled for Saturday, October 22 and is open to students in grades 4K-5 and their families. This gives Luck families the opportunity to get dressed up and enjoy a night of dancing and other fun activities, while supporting the basketball program.

The Luck Community Ed Scholarship Fundraiser/Lasagna Dinner will also return and is scheduled for January 24. \$200 scholarships were offered to every 2022 graduate this past May, and so far 11 graduates have applied and received their scholarships.

RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION - TAX LEVY

Be it resolved by the electors of the School District of Luck, that the proposed annual budget be accepted, and the tax levy be set at \$3,412,187.

RESOLUTION - SET BOARD SALARIES

Be it resolved by the electors of the School District of Luck, that the following yearly salaries be adopted for the members of the Board of Education for the 2022-2023 school year; President, a salary of \$1,500.00 and the directors, \$1,400.00 each. Be it also resolved that the Board members be paid their actual and necessary expenses when traveling outside the district in performance of his or her duties.

RESOLUTION - AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY BORROWING

Be it resolved the Board of Education is authorized to secure temporary loans up to \$1,000,000.00 the statutory limit, for the purpose of meeting the immediate expenses of maintaining the schools of the district. The amount of such loans shall be set by the Board of Education.

RESOLUTION - LUNCH PROGRAM

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck is hereby directed to furnish hot lunch and breakfast to any and all students of this district at such places and times, and at such cost as shall be set by said School Board; and the School Board is authorized to pay any deficiency which may result from the lunch program.

RESOLUTION - LEGAL COUNSEL

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck is authorized to secure legal advice in any school action that is deemed necessary by said Board.

RESOLUTION – TRANSPORTATION

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck be authorized to maintain a program of bus transportation, including those students who live under the two mile statutory limit.

RESOLUTION – 2022 ANNUAL MEETING

Be it resolved that the School District of Luck is authorized to set the Annual Meeting for 2023 for September 25th.
